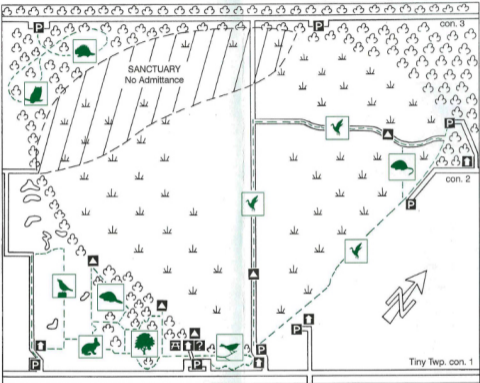

TRAILS



HABITAT TRAIL: 1.7 km.
 Visits forest, field and wetland habitats, boardwalk and observation tower. A trail guide is available which discusses management techniques.



HARE HIGHWAY: 0.7 km.
 This trail connects the Habitat and Meadowlark trails by following a row of highbush cranberry shrubs along the edge of a field.



BEAVERLAND TRAIL: 1.3 km.
 Follows a man-made channel through a swamp to the Mole Mountain Lookout. Returns through the forest. Many signs of wildlife to be found here.



MEADOWLARK TRAIL: 2.5 km.
 A field trail which follows the old farm lanes. Apple trees, shrubs and tall grasses host a variety of wildlife species.



WARBLER WALK: 0.7 km.
 A short, winding trail through nannyberry, highbush cranberry, cedar, spruce and aspen trees. A good place for songbirds and small mammals.



DIKE HIKE: 8.25 km.
 A wonderful way to explore Tiny Marsh. Muskrats, black terns, ducks and geese are easily seen. Follows the Trotter and North Carolina Dikes, returns along the east shore of marsh.



MUSKRAT TRAIL: 0.7 km.
 A short-cut of the Dike Trail. A footbridge overlooks channels cut through the cattails. This is a good place to find great blue herons, wood ducks and owls.



PORCUPINE LOOP: 0.8 km.
 A pleasant trail which winds through hardwood and mixed-wood forests. Look for porcupines and red squirrels in the hemlock trees.



SCREECH OWL TRAIL: 1.2 km.
 This trail visits the forest clearings which were cut to rejuvenate understory growth. Look for woodland wildlife.
